


## Thank You For Considering Young Theatre Makers!

# Why Join Our Youth Theatre Classes?

Our youth theatre classes are more than just acting lessons. We focus on:

- Confidence Building: We believe theatre is a powerful tool for young people to build selfesteem and find their unique voice. Through engaging exercises, games, and performance opportunities, young performers are encouraged to step out of their comfort zones, take creative risks, and develop the confidence to express their thoughts, feelings, and ideas both on and off the stage.
- **Teamwork:** Theatre is inherently collaborative, and our classes are designed to foster a sense of community and shared purpose. Young performers learn how to communicate effectively, listen to others, and work together to achieve a common goal. Through group exercises, ensemble work, and collaborative projects, they develop essential interpersonal skills such as empathy, leadership, and adaptability. By creating a supportive environment where everyone's contributions are valued, we ensure that each performer feels empowered to bring their best to the stage and beyond.
- Creativity: Our classes encourage young performers to think outside the box and embrace their imagination. Young Performers will explore acting techniques such as voice projection, character development, and emotional expression. They will also learn practical stagecraft, including set design, costume creation, and lighting basics, giving them a well-rounded understanding of what it takes to put on a successful performance. Additionally, we introduce elements of scriptwriting, directing, and stage management, ensuring students experience every facet of theatre production.

# What to Expect in Our Classes

#### Each session includes a mix of:

- Warm-up games to get everyone moving and focused.
- Acting exercises to develop performance skills.
- Group activities that encourage teamwork.
- Rehearsals for shows and performances.

Our performers work towards a showcase at the end of each year, providing an opportunity to perform for friends and family. Additionally, we stage at least one full production per year, giving our young performers the chance to experience the excitement and professionalism of a complete theatrical performance.

## National Theatre Connections

Our 13-19 year old classes provide a unique opportunity to participate in the National Theatre Connections programme. Connections is a nationwide youth theatre festival run by the National Theatre that offers young performers the chance to work on new plays written by leading playwrights. Each year, groups from across the UK perform these plays in regional theatres, with selected groups invited to perform at the National Theatre in London.

Participation in Connections helps young performers develop their skills, connect with the wider theatre community, and experience the excitement of bringing a professionally written play to life. It's an invaluable opportunity to grow both on stage and off, with guidance from our experienced tutors.
